

Reflexive Water (ed. Fons Elders) is the title of four debates between various philosophers (Chomsky, Foucault, Naess, Ayer, Kolakowski, Lefèbvre, Popper) with me as moderator. The way of thinking and arguing of the philosophers was so different that I needed **water** to embrace them (London 1974).

Philosophers have one root in common: their books are written on a chair, and their theories belong to a sedentary culture, as different from a nomadic culture as the earth differs from water. A prerequisite for creativity is fluidity between the various layers of human intelligence. If thinking starts moving as water, we realize that “who really thinks, is not hindered by ideas”.
